6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Reconstructing of curriculum is implemented after five years. It is systematically prepared by the experts and it is prescribed by the university.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

In the beginning of the academic year, the teachers are prepared teaching plan of each subjects in view of effective teaching learning system. The plan for effective teaching-learning process is kept flexible. It is because the process is implemented in accordance with the students' feedback and the evaluation of students' knowledge through home assignments, questionnaire and tutorials.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The evaluation is continues process through home assignments, tutorials, projects and oral-written tests. The college plans for transparent examination in two semesters excluding practical examination according to the university norms. The result of the examination either at college or university level must be declared within thirty days from the date of examination.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The IQAC focuses on the research activities and academic development of the teachers. As a part of encouragement for research activity, 14 teachers obtained Ph.D., five teachers got M. Phil, 212 research papers presented, 209 research papers published, five MRP's completed , other five are Ongoing and 11 books were published during the span of last five years.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college has its separate library with computer and internet facility. It has a separate seating for teachers and students. The books and infrastructure of library are augmented every year.

Challenges:


- 1) The cream flow of students is diverted to medical and engineering colleges.

- 4) Plan to effectively use the grants according to the purposes.


